Finzean Community Council – Spring 2023 Update

GETTING INVOLVED

The FCC is an elected body the purpose of which is to represent the views of Finzean residents to relevant authorities such as Aberdeenshire Council. The FCC meets around 6 times a year and any Finzean resident can attend. The current members of the Community Council are: myself (Chair), Andrew Douglas (Vice Chair), Zoe Mason Reid (Secretary), Alison Bell, Jim Buchan, Donna Duncan, Stuart Christie, Stuart Gordon and Davie Hector. There is space for a new Community Councillor if anyone is interested in joining, including a youth member aged 14 or 15. If so, please contact me by-mail below.

Our primary forum for communication and discussion is the FCC Facebook group, which at the time of writing has 149 members, although we also post notices of meetings etc on the noticeboard by Farquharson Park.

TELECOMMS MASTS

Like London buses, there were no applications for telecomms masts in the Finzean Area and then we had the "site 16" mast application, which has now been followed by an application for a potential second mast up the Forest of Birse.

The first proposed mast (Site 16) was the subject of the public meeting in September last year. There were 6 supporting comments and 11 objections to the application which is currently being reviewed by the Council Planning Engineers, who have requested some additional information. It is likely that the application will go to the next available Marr Area Committee Meeting. If it does go to the Area Meeting, then Finzean Community Council (FCC) have requested to speak at the meeting. We will support the application, based on the local poll conducted at the end of last year, which had an 84% majority in favour of the mast.

In February, there was a planning application for a 25 metre tall mast in the Forest of Birse, about 1 kilometre north on Burnfoot (details are in the Aberdeenshire planning portal – search on Birse). We were not aware of this potential application before their pre consultation letter arrived on 10th February. Since then, there have been a number of discussions on the proposal and Cornerstone (the agent) have agreed to move the date for comments on the proposal to be submitted back from 23rd March to the end of April. Cornerstone have also agreed to provide photomontages of the proposed mast from 4 different sites in the area. The Community Council intend to hold a public meeting on the proposal once we have received the photomontages.

Cornerstone were aware of the Site 16 application and have provide a coverage map which shows that the 2 masts cover different areas. Therefore, we do not believe that the new proposal impacts the site 16 application.

SPEEDING IN FINZEAN VILLAGE

The Community Council continue to be concerned about cars speeding through the village. After many e-mails, and meetings, Aberdeenshire Council have informed us that they will be replacing the radar controlled speed signs at either end of the village in the near future. We have also been putting up PC Speedy (the cut out policeman) up at regular intervals to try and encourage people to slow down when they are in Finzean Village.

THE WALL AT FARQUHARSON PARK

The wall at Farquharson Park has been repaired and a new gate installed in order to help prevent small children straying onto the road while they are at the playground.

DIGITAL ENGAGEMENT PRESENTATION ON Fri 31st MARCH

FCC have been contacted by a company called Broadway Partners who are looking to provide an improved level of Broadband service in this area. They gave an initial presentation to around 30 local residents in November last year and are coming back to Finzean to give a presentation in Finzean Hall at 7.00 pm on Friday 31st March for around an hour, in order gather more support for their proposal. We will provide an update on the Facebook page if this progresses.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The generator which will supply emergency power to the Hall is now in place and we have an outline plan for providing support to those that need it in the event of another incident. If there is a major event, please go to the Hall if you need support or are able to help out other more vulnerable people. We intend to communicate via notices in the hall, on our Facebook group and the two noticeboards in the event of a future emergency situation.

Birse Community Trust Update

At the time of writing BCT is concerned about the siting of the proposed telecommunications mast in the native regenerating pinewoods on the North Hill Forest of Birse ("Site 16" as described in the FCC update on the previous page). As things are moving quickly, we would refer you to our website for the latest information: https://www.birsecommunitytrust.org.uk/

It has been a busy winter for BCT with some exciting new developments. First however we have to say thank you to Martin Ferries for his amazing work on resurfacing the section of Finzean Community Path at Boghead. What a difference he has made, and thank you to everyone for such positive feedback. Thank you especially to Paths for All and the Scottish Government Healthier Scotland Project, for funding part of the project.

We have also been working with Aberdeen City Ranger Service to uplift young pine seedlings from the tracks in the Forest of Birse, where scraping is due to take place. The Rangers are transplanting the pines on Elrick Hill where they are trying to re-establish native Caledonian pinewoods. They needed a local provenance source of pine trees, we needed the tracks scraping to allow access in case of fire so the timing was perfect.

John Threlfall's Art Classes at Finzean Old school are continuing in popularity this term with a new class, A Gentle Guide to the Art of Drawing / Seeing, plus the popular Mindfulness of Drawing class, Pastels and Advanced Drawing. Birse Art Club also meets at Finzean Old School each Friday morning with a more informal remit to help and encourage each other, new members are always welcome.

At the beginning of March, we held our Community Consultation and Open Afternoon at the Old School to give people an opportunity to meet the architects and share ideas, and join in with family activities. It was a cold day so thank you to all who came out to meet us and join in, taking part in Rubbish Archaeology, sifting through the Old School midden for treasure, making bug hotels and helping to plant vellow rattle seeds in our fledgling meadow area.

Wild About Birse are running various events. The popular Night Sky talk was on a damp cloudy night but Sam Robinson of Tomintoul and Glenlivet Dark Skies Park gave an excellent talk.

Still to Come

We are hosting a **Traditional Signwriting** course here at the Old School run by Owen Bushell which we are very excited about on 19th March.

On 30 April we will be running **An Introduction to Birdsong** at Slewdrum Forest.

We also have a **Family Friendly Badger talk** on Saturday 29th April from Scottish Badgers, with different talks and activities from 4.30: There is no charge but Scottish Badgers welcome donations and there will be badger merchandise to buy at both events.

- 4.30 p.m. Scottish Badgers talk for adults and children of all ages, 'The life of badgers where they live, what they eat, what they do' the biology and ecology of badgers. Slides, photos, and video, plus demonstration of artefacts.
- 5.30 p.m. break we would love to display your badger pictures on our Facebook page so please bring your badger works of art to show us and the badger experts!
- 6.00 p.m. Badgers, the Law and types of persecution suitable for adults and older children only
- 6.45 p.m. Finish
